Established in 1988 Pickens County Middle School (PCMS) was the first middle school in Pickens County, and has a current enrollment of approximately 500 students in grades 6-8. It was originally accredited by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) in 1998. PCMS is committed to providing the best quality education and the best learning opportunity possible for all of our students. Its goal is to maintain a friendly, safe, secure, and orderly environment and atmosphere in all of our classes and on all of our buses. It will continually strive to develop a school climate that is characterized by mutual respect between students and staff who work cooperatively to produce high levels of quality schoolwork.
